The Weald Meadows Initiative (WMI)

The project's purpose is to ensure the long term survival of the irreplaceable species rich grassland of the Weald. This is done through providing practical support to landowners.

As a direct result of WMI many meadows have been recognised, protected, enhanced or created utilising native seed of a good local provenance. Only around four percent of our native lowland meadows survive in this country, in the Weald it is higher at approximately five percent. Thanks to this project the diminishing trend is now being reversed.
